Key Points Highlighted by NICCI:

- India's rise as a \$4 trillion economy is a strategic milestone for the region.
- Nepal's economic and infrastructural integration with India—through trade, tourism, and transport—is extensive and vital.
- Over 90% of Nepal's international trade flows through Indian routes, underscoring the importance of continued bilateral cooperation.
- India's initiatives such as PM Gati Shakti, UDAN, Make in India, and Neighbourhood
 First are transforming regional connectivity and economic resilience.
- India's leadership in fostering **inclusive regional development** can serve as a blueprint for broader Indo-Pacific engagement.

5. Strategic Themes Discussed

a) Economic Connectivity & Market Access

- Opportunities for South Asian countries to access Southeast Asian markets via India.
- Enhancement of **blue economy initiatives**, port development, and maritime trade.

b) Regional Stability & Strategic Balance

- Indo-Pacific cooperation allows smaller countries to diversify partnerships.
- Encourages multi-polar collaboration through platforms like IORA, BIMSTEC, ASEAN, and the Quad.

c) Nepal's Potential Role

- Nepal, while land-linked and smaller in size, is rich in natural resources and strategic in location.
- With strong people-to-people ties and infrastructural links, Nepal is well-positioned to benefit from India-led regional initiatives.
